

Welcome to FLEX onboarding guide

FLEX is recommended as a tool to help your institution store, manage and access your content in one central place while being confident that you are staying within the allowable limits of your Statutory Education Licence.

What is FLEX?

FLEX comes with your Copyright Agency Statutory Education Licence. It is a cloud-based platform developed to help librarians, content managers and educators prepare course reading material simply and efficiently.

Types of content available

As a FLEX user, you can access book extracts and journal articles from four different sources:

- 1. Your own scans
- 2. Other institutions' scans
- **3.** Publishers high resolution journal articles and book extracts
- **4.** British Library scans available if you have created an account with the British Library

Getting started

- 3. Adding/sharing content

Content management

The following articles will help you access, create and manage content in FLEX:

Reporting

There are several reporting tools available in FLEX. The most commonly used reports are:

- My institution's report and Downloads per content item – these reports record data on student engagement with content
- **British Library Reporting** helpful if you have ordered scans from the British Library
